26/01/18 - Thefts from rural home in Heanley Lane, Hurley

Please be aware that at around 2.30am on 24 January, offenders entered the grounds of a rural home in Heanley Lane, Hurley and stole a John Deere ride on lawn mower along with a Brian James 4 wheel trailer which were chained together.

The offenders were disturbed when dogs at the premises began to bark and abandoned the items near to the road. A bright yellow steel box and its contents were stolen.

24/01/18 - Survey of Victims and Survivors in Warwickshire

If you have been affected by crime in Warwickshire, we want to hear your views so we can improve the help available for victims and survivors. Philip Seccombe, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Warwickshire, says: "No one asks to become a victim of crime and it is therefore vital that they receive the right level of service and support when they do. As Commissioner I also recognise that some people see themselves as victims, others as survivors of crime. I will put them at the heart of the criminal justice system and make them the central focus for Warwickshire Police and partner agencies at all stages, to assist victims and survivors of crime to cope, recover and achieve justice."

To help achieve this aim, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) for Warwickshire wants to hear the views of victims and survivors to help shape future support services in the local area. This survey is being run for the OPCC by TONIC, an independent social research organisation (read more about them here: www.tonic.org.uk).

You do not have to have reported a crime to take part in this survey - everyone's views are welcome.

TONIC are registered with the Information Commissioners' Office (Ref: ZA273132).

23/01/18 - Incidents at homes in Ryefield Lane, Wishaw & Coleshill Road, Curdworth

Please be aware of the following incidents, which have occurred at homes in your area over recent days:

Incident 219 of 22 January - At around 2pm on 22 January, the resident of a cottage home in Ryefield Lane, Wishaw,

was about to open the door of the house when three masked young male offenders opened the door from the inside. The offenders ran back into the premises and made off, through a ground floor bedroom window, on foot, towards Wishaw village .

The resident entered the premises to discover that the offenders had forced open a rear window and climbed into the cottage. Once inside, the offenders carried out a search before opening a safe and stealing items of jewellery and a quantity of cash from inside.

Incident 166 of 22 January - During the night of 21 into 22 January, offenders stole a Vauxhall Astra vehicle which was parked outside a home in Coleshill Road, Curdworth.
