Neighbourhood Policing

We are your Safer Neighbourhood Team across Coleshill and Atherstone. We are dedicated to serving our communities. We work with you, with local authorities, and with community leaders to solve problems and understand what's important to you. We know that collaboration between police and communities is one of the best ways to cut crime and keep people safe. Effective local policing is about more than just fighting crime, it's about building relationships, understanding local concerns and being where it matters most. OP PLENTY

#OpPlenty has now launched in **Atherstone, Coleshill and the surrounding villages.**

The scheme was already running in Nuneaton and Bedworth, and since last year, there were 35 people visited as a result of Op Plenty.

Op Plenty involves our Safer Neighbourhood Team officers dropping by the homes of vulnerable people in our community for a cup of tea and a chat to check whether they are OK and if there's any further support that can be provided.

Inspector Andi Gibbons of North Warwickshire Safer Neighbourhood Team said "We're very happy to announce our support of Op Plenty in Atherstone and the surrounding villages. "We are in quite a rural part of the county, and we're aware that this can sometimes make the loneliness of older people in particular who find travelling difficult more pronounced. "Op Plenty gives us a way of finding out where those who would appreciate us dropping by are, and a reason to check in."

Operations

OP RESOLVE – ATHERSTONE

PC Steve Taylor, officer for Atherstone town centre, has secured the conviction of a shoplifter who assaulted a shopworker.

While we will look at a range of options for dealing with shoplifters everybody has a right to go work without fear of violence and we will always look to prosecute when a shopworker has been assaulted.

The woman assaulted the shopworker after she confronted her following the incident on 15 February. After pleading guilty to theft and assault, she will now undergo a six-month drug rehabilitation course. We hope she will take this time to reflect on her actions and the impact it had on her victim.

We continue to work very closely with businesses and encourage them to report all incidents of shoplifting so we can investigate and bring those responsible for justice.

In case you missed it, PC Taylor spoke last month about the good work he has been doing that has led to a 43% drop in shoplifting in Atherstone Town Centre.

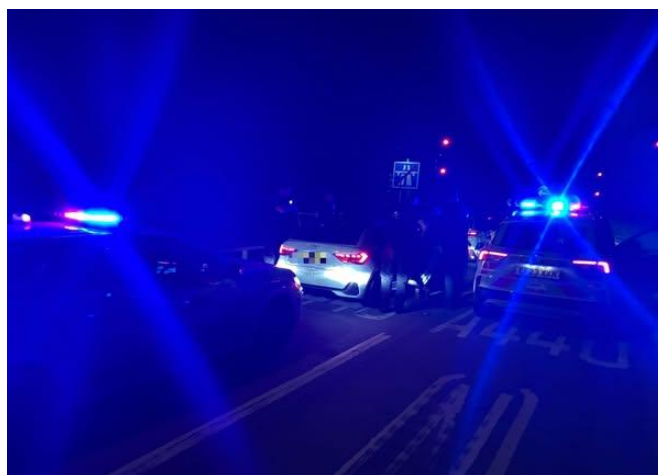
Officers had just cleared a job where a cloned vehicle had been used to commit a burglary before making off from our OPU (Traffic Officers) ...

Whilst travelling along the M6 a vehicle pinged our in-car ANPR saying that the occupants were wanted in connection with an offence.

The vehicle was stopped, occupants detained, and enquiries conducted.

As a result of this, the occupant was arrested on suspicion of Attempt Murder and taken into custody for further questioning.

Ps. The offenders from the original cloned vehicle were arrested too for Burglary and Fail to Stop.



OP ROSEPOOL - Off Road Bikes

OP ROSEPOOL – Illegal use of off-road bikes.

Due to the ongoing issues with off road bikes in North Warwickshire, North Warwickshire Safer Neighbourhood Team now have a dedicated operation for the illegal use of off-road bikes.

Operation Rosepool aims to tackle the illegal use of offroad bikes and nuisance bikes and the impacts they have on the communities in North Warwickshire.

Due to reports of ongoing nuisance bike issues and traffic offences being conducted by drivers, Atherstone officers conducted a Vehicle Operation near the Clock Bridge.

Eight vehicles were stopped as a result of the operation and no nuisance bikes were seen.

Please continue your reports or concerns of any issues with nuisance bikes or concerns of traffic offences being occurred. We listen to your reports and will conduct further operations.

The Off Road Team have been patrolling hotspot areas.

A Section 59 Warning Notice has been issued to a male who has been riding an off-road bike on the road in one of the villages. If we see him riding the bike again, it will be seized. Further off-road bike patrols will be conducted over the next couple months.

If you witness someone riding an off-road bike in an antisocial manner, please report them through the QR code below.



As many may have experienced within the local community, the rise in Anti-social behaviour involving a large number of motorbikes.

Most of these bikes are driven illegally without insurance and pose a danger to the community. Therefore, we need to encourage the community to inform of us of these concerns with as much information as possible so we can get these bikes off the streets and crushed.

We can also issue the driver a Section 59 which grants us the powers to seize and remove vehicles that are being used to cause alarm, distress or annoyance, careless or inconsiderate manner and off-road driving, this will last for 12 months. A section 59 also applies to both the driver and the vehicle so even if someone else drives the same vehicle in an anti-social manner, we can still enforce it.

Officers have been on patrol in a reported hotspot for off road bikes.

Whilst conducting patrols, officers came across this bike which had come across farmland onto a public highway and attempted to get away on the canal. Unfortunately, this did not work.

The bike has been seized the rider reported for no insurance and issued a section 59.



Operations

OP CAR KEY BURGLARY – VEHICLE CRIME

Atherstone SNT have been out distributing car safety advice and faraday pouches round local hotspot areas for car crime.

We will be running this type of scheme and will be exploring more areas, as well as conducting the Car Key Burglary operation soon.

You may have us knocking at your door with a surprise.



Officers from Coleshill SNT conducted a Car Key Burglary Operation in Water Orton.

Officers checked multiple car doors and only found 1 insecure. The owner was made aware and given crime prevention advice.

Further operations will be conducted.

OP TAVACO – VEHICLE CRIME

Officers from Atherstone SNT have located this stolen vehicle.

A member of public called in to advise there were some suspicious behaviours in the area, when the officers arrived, they realised that the vin number did not match the number plates that were being displayed.

The vehicle was sent for forensic examination before it gets returned to the owners.

With the support from Coleshill & Atherstone SNT officers were able to quickly identify the van stolen and its location which has now been forensically recovered.

Appeal for information

In between responding to 999 calls PC 2723 and PC 2762 from D Shift response have been conducting proactive patrols of North Warwickshire throughout the night.

Areas patrolled include Coleshill, Maxstoke, Water Orton, Middleton, Kingsbury, Dordon, Grendon, Polesworth, Newton Regis, Austrey, Warton and Shustoke.



PCSO Smith has been working in partnership with North Warwickshire Borough Council to tackle school parking issues on North Warwickshire West patch.

North Warwickshire Borough Council kindly supplied PCSO Smith with "no parking" traffic cones which have been given to several schools.

We hope that enforcing these parking restriction will remind parents/carers to park sensibly and appropriately.

School parking patrols will be conducted before the summer holidays.

Thank you to our schools for reminding parents/carers to park appropriately when dropping off/ collecting their children from school.



We received reports of an abandoned vehicle in Curdworth.

Officers have attended the location and confirmed there was a vehicle which had no MOT, no Tax and no Insurance.

The vehicle was insecure, and it was clear it had previously been used in crime. It has now been recovered.

More great team work after three males left the Co-op on Longstreet, Atherstone with a shopping basket full of meat.

Staff alerted CCTV operators through the retail radio and the offenders were monitored leaving in a vehicle out of the town.

Unfortunately, for them Atherstone SNT officers were just coming back into the town and stopped the vehicle.

Two males have been arrested for an outstanding theft that occurred during the weekend and further theft from the Co-op and were taken to custody.

The vehicle has also been seized for no insurance and false plates.

PC 2300 Thompson & PC 1372 Breeze from Coleshill safer neighbourhood team have been out on the south patch of north Warwickshire conducting high visibility patrols to various hotspots which have been brought to our attention by local residents.

Locations patrolled were as follows:

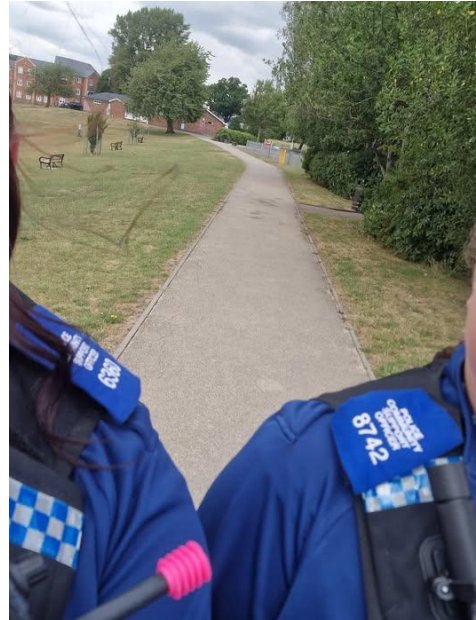
- Shustoke – Patrols were conducted around Reservoir Drive and Bixhill Lane due to reports of suspicious activity and anti-social behaviour occurring in the location.
- Gun Hill – Patrols were conducted on Gun Hill due to recent anti-social behaviour incidents.
- Ansley – High visibility patrols were conducted in various locations in the area due to reports of anti-social behaviour.
- Corley Services – Patrols were conducted on foot in the services where local businesses were linked in with by officers due to recent report of thefts happening in the services. Officers also conducted high visibility patrols of HGV parks with our ongoing efforts to reduce HGV crime in the area as part of our problem-solving plan for the area.
- Coleshill – Patrols have been carried out on the high street in the town due to ASB reports in the location. We are fully aware of the main issues occurring on the high street which we are currently escalating formally alongside conducting our patrols. Patrols were also conducted on Station Road and Kendal Avenue due to recent concerns raised by residents.
- Maxstoke – Officers paid attention to Castle Lane due to reports of excess speed, going forward we will be adding this location to our list to conduct speed watch operations.



PCSO Smith and PCSO Rygielski conducted high visibility foot patrols around Coleshill Town.

It was a great opportunity to speak to residents who were out and about.

Further foot patrols will be conducted.

Arrests and Outcomes

Drink drive arrest in Lea Marston.

A male was taken to custody after an incident at approximately 22:20 hours on 7th July where he is alleged to have left the scene after a two-vehicle collision.

A Range Rover was identified as being involved and officers have located the vehicle, caused it to stop and the driver provided a positive sample of breath.



It was like being on an episode of Bullseye on Friday 11th July for some local officers with a jet ski, motor home, motorbikes all being recovered after suspected to have been stolen and two persons so far being arrested.

Great work by local officers.

Last Friday afternoon officers have attended Ansley in response to a tracker activation on a reported stolen vehicle.

When Officers arrived, a vehicle has driven towards officers and did not stop when requested.

Officers have then recovered a stolen motor home on false plates from the location.

In other units four Yamaha motor bikes suspected to be stolen were found and a suspected stolen jet ski.

A person was then arrested with a cannabis factory located at a separate location but directly linked to the incident.

A second person has since been arrested and investigation is still ongoing with further arrests to follow.

Incident number 49 -11/7/25 relates.

Atherstone & Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team have been working alongside Trading Standards conducting warrants on two local stores.

Whilst at a store in Coleshill, a large quantity of counterfeit items was located in a parked vehicle conveniently situated near to the back entrance.



Unfortunately for the owner, not only did they lose their stash of fake ciggies and vapes but the vehicle too after it was found to have no insurance or tax.



Community Engagement

21 businesses across Coleshill High Street will have a direct radio link with us and each other.

The new retail radio scheme is based on a model that's been used across Warwickshire with success to target anti-social behaviour and other crimes affecting town centres.

After months of groundwork and funding from the force and North Warwickshire Council, 21 radios will be given to pubs and shops on the high street. Local Sergeant Adam Skelsey said: "This hasn't been done in Coleshill before, so this is a big step forward for us.

"I've been on working specifically in neighbourhood policing for about seven years now, and I've seen the really positive effect these radio schemes have.



"It's not just about businesses being able to talk to each other, it's giving them that direct line to us so we know what's going on.

"In addition to our foot and vehicle patrols, this also means that we've effectively got another 21 pairs of eyes – and they're able to spot things early and speak to us.

"This is great for shops and pubs alike. For the pubs, it'll mean they can alert us – and other pubs – to any customers causing issues. It also means they can more easily enforce the banning of problem customers through the Pubwatch scheme.

"We're getting really positive feedback from businesses before it even launches and we're all looking forward to seeing what the impact is.

"Ultimately, this is about helping everyone in Coleshill to feel a bit safer – and to deter those involved in anti-social behaviour or any other crime.

Over the past 6 weeks, PCSO Payne has been completing the second scheme of Junior PCSOs at Outwoods Primary School.

On 16th July they had their presentation assembly, where we had Inspector Gibbons join us and helped give the children their certificates.

We had 9 Junior PCSOs that took part in the scheme. We have these schemes running all the way through till spring term next year.

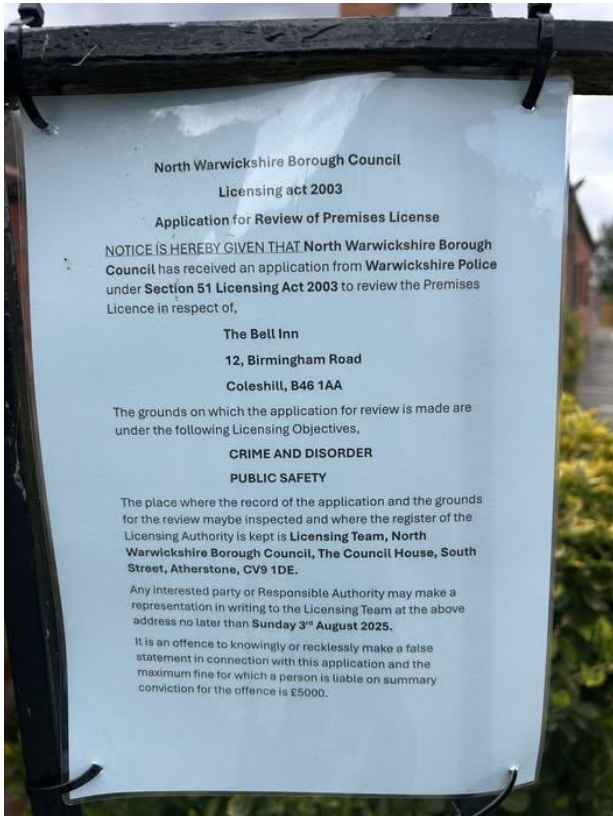

Bobbies on the beat

Message from our response officers last week:

On 10th July in-between responding to 999 calls PC 2723 and PC 2595 from D Shift response have been busy conducting patrols around North Warwickshire.

Areas patrolled include Coleshill, Wishaw, Middleton, Warton, Dordon, Polesworth, Atherstone, Nether Whitacre, Kingsbury, Alvecote, Seckington, No Man's Heath and the A5 corridor.

In Coleshill a male was spoken to by the officers after he was seen to be sat in a vehicle at 4am close to a premises which was recently burgled. All checked out and the male was in fact just about to start work in the local area. Appropriate crime prevention advice was given.

In Polesworth a BMW was seen outside an address with all its lights left on. After closer inspection it transpired that this was an innocent member of the public just returning home after work. Due to the time of night and recent increase in thefts of BMW's officers believed the vehicle may have been in the process of being stolen.



And finally, apologies if you were held up in traffic on the junction 10 roundabout of the M42 at around 6am. Officers were assisting with the recovery of a vehicle after a road traffic collision.

We have made numerous linked arrests recently and conducted various operations but one of the main targets for criminals is unlocked vehicles. Please make sure your vehicle and property is secure.



Community Speed Watch

PCSO Yaqub has been training volunteers for speed watch this month.

This month, the speed watch teams have been out conducting speed checks in the villages. The community speed watch groups are a valued part of our communities. E-Scooters

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of 'powered transporters'. This covers a range of personal transport devices that are powered by a motor.

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. This means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters including the need to have a licence and insurance. There are two ways of using an e-scooter:

- by privately owning one
- by renting one through an authorised rental scheme

Owning your own e-scooter

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres. If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance. If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter, the incident will be investigated in the same way it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car. Where you can use your own e-scooter: If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it in on private land, such as in a garden. But you must have the permission of the landowner to do so.

Vehicle Crime

Do you have a keyless entry vehicle?

Thieves can steal your keyless vehicle by hijacking and amplifying the signal from your start device (key) in order to start your vehicle.

Help to protect your vehicle by:

- Make sure your vehicle is properly locked/secure and keep your key away from doors and windows. This will reduce the chance of criminals amplifying the signal.
- Some keys have a function allowing them to be turned off. Check your manual to see if yours does and then use it.
- Use some kind of physical barrier such as a steering wheel lock (preferably a disk lock), instal a driving parking post or use a wheel clamp. This will deter many criminals as it will be time consuming for them to move the vehicle.
- Fit a tracking device into your vehicle.
- Keep your keys in a Faraday bag to block the signal to your keys.
- Remove batteries from your spare key or put them in a separate Faraday pouch.

And remember to be on the lookout for people acting suspiciously and report it by calling 999!

PCSO Mitchell and PCSO Smith have been out distributing faraday pouches.

These have been distributed around some of our high targeted areas. The pouches have very kindly been purchased by North Warwickshire Borough Council, in our steps to tackling vehicle crime.

Initial police response to vehicle crime.

Initial call managed by either LPRC or control room and if the incident is live and ongoing seek immediate deployment.

During the initial contact, the call taker will provide reassurance and discuss all investigative opportunities such as CCTV, Witnesses, Forensic opportunities with the victim or witness.

These questions and responses will be documented on the Strom log and an investigation is then created.

Call taker will provide scene preservation advice to the victim

Should there be no investigative opportunities the investigation will be sent to the CCC to complete and record a review and ensure that all investigative opportunities have been considered.

At this stage a decision will be made to either file the investigation if there are no further opportunities to pursue a positive outcome or allocate to an officer with an action plan should further potential investigative opportunities exist to seek a positive outcome.
