Operations

OP Town Safe – 02/02/2026

As our continued commitment to keeping Atherstone town centre safe Atherstone SNT has been working with the parish council and CCTV panel in producing new signage for town.

We are pleased to say these are now fitted throughout the town centre along with roads entering Atherstone town just above the flower borders promoting the use of the retail radio network and CCTV in the town centre.



Atherstone SNT have been working with the town CCTV operators after a large group of youths were monitored in the town centre causing anti-social behaviour towards resident's properties and canal barges on Friday evening 23/02/26. The parents have since been spoken to regarding their child's behaviour and were incredibly supportive of police contact.

OP YARD – What It Is and Why It Matters

Operation Yard is a targeted policing initiative focused on reducing HGV-related crime at motorway service stations and freight hubs. These locations are essential rest points for drivers, but they're also vulnerable to offences such as fuel theft, load interference, vehicle break-ins, and organised criminal activity.

The purpose of Operation Yard is to:

- Protect HGV drivers and their cargo.
- Identify and disrupt offenders operating around service stations.
- Increase visibility and reassurance in high-risk areas.
- Gather intelligence linked to freight crime and organised networks.
- Work with partner agencies and service-station operators to improve safety.

Officers conduct patrols, speak with drivers, check vehicles linked to intelligence, and monitor behaviour around the services to spot early signs of criminal activity. By focusing on the places where HGV drivers rest and refuel, Operation Yard aims to keep the road network safer, prevent costly thefts, and support those who play a vital role in keeping goods moving across the country.



DOB EM IN

04/02/2026 A male has been arrested on suspicion of an assault after an incident in Coleshill this morning. The male has persistently tried to evade officers by trying to ride away on his electric bike but has now been detained.

The male does not have the appropriate documents for the bike, so this has now also been seized.

Male in custody.



You can ride a privately owned e-bike in public without a licence if you are over fourteen, but it must meet certain requirements.

They must have a maximum power output of 250 watts and a maximum speed of 15.5mph.

They also must be pedal assisted, meaning you must pedal for the motor to kick in, rather than simply pressing a button or twisting a throttle.

If they do not meet these criteria, they are classed as a motorbike or moped so must be registered, taxed, and insured, while riders must hold a licence or wear a helmet.

Police have powers to seize e-scooters and e-bikes that do not comply under Section 1658A of the Road Traffic Act 1988, having a vehicle on the road without insurance.

The offence can result in a criminal prosecution, typically attracting six penalty points when dealt with in court, however it is dealt with simply by way of seizure.

If you witness someone riding an off-road bike in an antisocial manner, please report them through the QR code below.



As many may have experienced within the local community, the rise in Anti-social behaviour involving a large number of motorbikes.

Most of these bikes are driven illegally without insurance and pose a danger to the community. Therefore, we need to encourage the community to inform of us of these concerns with as much information as possible so we can get these bikes off the streets and crushed.

We can also issue the driver a Section 59 which grants us the powers to seize and remove vehicles that are being used to cause alarm, distress, or annoyance, careless or inconsiderate manner and off-road driving, this will last for 12 months. A section 59 also applies to both the driver and the vehicle so even if someone else drives the same vehicle in an anti-social manner, we can still enforce it.

Operation Rosepool – Tackling Off-Road Bike ASB

Operation Rosepool is a dedicated policing operation focused on tackling **anti-social behaviour involving off-road bikes**. We know how disruptive illegal, or irresponsible off-road bike use can be to our communities — from noise and intimidation to damage of parks, fields, and public spaces. Through Op Rosepool, officers are working proactively to:

- **Identify and target** individuals using off-road bikes illegally or dangerously
- **Seize uninsured or unroadworthy bikes**
- **Increase patrols in hotspot areas**
- **Gather intelligence** from the community to support enforcement
- **Work with partners** to reduce long-term harm and keep public spaces safe

Our aim is simple: **to reduce harm, prevent anti-social behaviour, and protect communities** from the ongoing issues caused by nuisance off-road bikes. If you have information that could support Operation Rosepool, please report it via our usual channels. Your information helps us take action.

Bobbies on the Beat Atherstone

02/02/2026 PCSO Scott & PC Taylor have seized this van in Church Street, Atherstone after checks showed it had no insurance, mot or Tax. Despite the driver's best efforts of initially denying driving the van our town centre cctv operators confirmed the driver resulting him being reported for the offences.



03/02/2023 Residents have advised police of the below van been parked up for weeks with nobody locally knowing who its owner was, but it had been declared of the road. Officers have attended and the vehicle has been removed.



On 01/02/2026 Atherstone special constable last night have been out conducting patrols of North Warwickshire as well as responding to urgent calls to the police. Whilst out they have taken some pictures of some of the areas patrolled but not all. Special constables are volunteers and support police by volunteering their time.



Officers from Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team have successfully recovered a stolen Toyota C-HR this afternoon, after it was reported stolen during the early hours of 05/02/2026 from an address in Bedworth.



On the afternoon of 09/02/2026 PC Taylor & PCSO Hodson have been on patrol in Mancetter and have come across this vehicle which was seized for no Insurance / documents.



01/02/2026 Late night to early morning patrols have been carried out by town centre PCSO Scott around Atherstone residential and industrial estates to combat car keyless thefts.

We still have plenty of free Faraday Pouches kindly funded by the NWBC Community Safety Partnership Team.

Bobbies on the Beat Atherstone

On 15/02/2026 PCSO Thompson & PCSO Payne have been on foot patrols around Austrey & Hartshill this evening, visiting ASB hotspots and recent vehicle theft locations. We've received reports of vehicle crime opportunists out in North Warwickshire over the weekend, so please keep your vehicles locked and valuables out of sight.



20/02/2026 Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood officers have recovered five stolen motorbikes following a tracker activation that led them to a storage site in Bedworth. Although this location is not within the team's usual policing area, officers were determined to support the victim and acted on the information provided. During a search of a shipping container at the site, officers discovered a further four stolen motorbikes, with some reported stolen from across the UK as far back as October 2025. It is believed the bikes were likely destined to be exported outside of the UK and may never have been recovered if it wasn't for the persistence and determination of the officers involved. An investigation is now underway, and the motorbikes will be returned to their rightful owners. If you have any information about motorcycle theft or suspicious activity, please report via the Warwickshire Police website.



On 10/02/2026 after acting on community intelligence local officers attended a central Atherstone address. A stolen motorbike, quad and various nitrous oxide cannisters were located. A female was arrested and bailed after being found at the address. Also located was some cannabis and a variety of weapons were also found at the location. The housing authorities are also now taking action and further enquires are also being conducted by officers.



22/02/2026 officers assisted trading standards with visits to two premises on Long street, Atherstone. With the help of a highly trained four-legged friend, we found counterfeit cigarettes in both premises. Trading standards are the lead agent in tobacco offences and will conduct their investigation accordingly.



25/02/2026 Officers from Atherstone SNT and Rural Crime spoke with their counter parts in Leicestershire police Neighbourhood team on how to best deal with cross border crime and sharing knowledge to tackle and reduce crime on both areas.



Bobbies on the Beat Coleshill

On the 01/02/2026 PCSO Mitchell has been out on patrol across the Coleshill South and West patches. While conducting routine patrols, he came across a dumped stolen vehicle as well as another vehicle causing an obstruction on the roadway.

The stolen vehicle was recovered, and we will work to get it returned to its rightful owner as soon as possible.

We would also like to take this opportunity to remind residents to park considerately and lawfully, ensuring that emergency vehicles, neighbours, and other road users are not obstructed.



16/02/2026 PCSO Yaqub from Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team conducted reassurance patrols at Coleshill, Shustoke, Maxstoke, Fillongley, Over Whitacre, Corley Services, Corley and Corley Moor due to having received incidents such as vehicle crime including anti-social behaviour.



On 20/02/2026 PCSO Yaqub from Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team conducted early morning patrols in Coleshill, Shustoke, Maxstoke, Over Whitacre, Fillongley, Corley, Corley Services and Corley Moor due to recent suspicious activity raised by the community. All was in order however patrols will continue.



On the 20/02/2026, our officers have been carrying out increased patrols at Corley Services following reports of thefts from lorries in the area.

We know the impact this is having on drivers, haulage companies, and the wider supply chain.

We're asking drivers to remain vigilant, report anything suspicious immediately, and ensure vehicles are secured.

Your information helps us build a clearer picture and take action. If you see something that doesn't look right, please let us know.



Bobbies on the Beat Coleshill

22/02/2026 This weekend, PC 2300 Thompson, PC 1372 Breeze and PC 2633 Tamburro have conducted high visibility foot patrols in Coleshill. Officers have been out on foot speaking with licensed premises staff, conducting walk throughs of local pubs as well as patrolling ASB hotspot locations which have been brought to our attention.



On 22/02/2026 We've received several reports over the past few days of off-road bikes causing a nuisance around the Lea Marston and Hams Hall areas.

This includes bikes being ridden in a dangerous manner and creating noise disruption to residents. In response, officers have increased patrols across the affected locations and have been out speaking with nearby residents to gather information and offer reassurance. Your feedback has been invaluable, and we'll continue to work with the community to tackle the issue.

If you see any off-road bikes being used illegally or causing a disturbance, please report it to us. The more information we receive, the better we can target our patrols and take appropriate action.



22/02/2026 Over the past two early mornings, PCSO Yaqub from Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team has carried out further high visibility reassurance patrols following recent reports of vehicle crime and suspicious incidents in the area.

These patrols aim to provide a visible policing presence, gather information, and support ongoing investigative work. Patrols were conducted at Coleshill, Shustoke, Maxstoke, Over Whitacre, Ansley Village, Ansley Common, Ansley Village, Old Arley, New Arley, Birchley Heath, Fillongley, Corley, Corley Moor, Astley and Corley Services.



On the 25/02/2026 in Water Orton officers patrolling have come across two youths on an electric bike with the youth's wearing balaclavas and initially refusing to stop for officers.

The bike was being used on a sports field which was heavily waterlogged causing damage to the local community.

After little bit of "chase me" officers have detained one of the youths and he is now being processed.

Arrests and Outcomes

A male has been arrested on the morning of 02/02/2026 in the central Coleshill area on suspicion of burglary, theft from motor vehicle and bail offences.

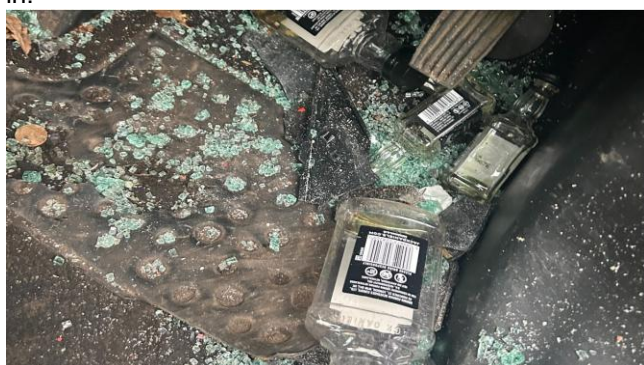
The male was found by officers asleep in a car outside his home address all that work must have made him feel sleepy.....

The local resident who is a council tenant will also possibly be in breach of his housing tenancy and information will be passed to the council for further action.



Update on the above, the male has been remanded in police custody and has appeared in court on the 03/02/2026 and has been remanded in custody until his hearing in March.

On the 16/02/2026 male is currently in custody on suspicion of burglary after an incident at a golf club in Ansley. One suspect from Nuneaton has been arrested at approx 02:00 hours this morning after being found in a vehicle near to the location after a report of a break in.



At approximately 14:40 hours last Thursday (12/2/26) officers attended a report of a collision on Trinity Road, Kingsbury between a public bus and a car.

Upon police arrival the driver of the car was clearly well intoxicated and arrested.

The road was closed; fire service and ambulance were also required at the scene

The picture is the footwell of the driver's car.

The driver who was a local male also had a revoked licence. He subsequently failed to provide a sample for a breath test so was ultimately charged with various offences.

The driver and elderly bus passengers fortunately escaped with minor injuries.

Don't drink and drive!

Warwickshire Police can confirm that a horsebox stolen from the Hartshill area during the early hours of 11/02/2026 has been successfully recovered. The theft was reported to us at 06:51, and following intelligence work by Warwickshire Police, key information was shared with Northants Police, who located and recovered the vehicle by 10:45 the same morning. We are grateful for their swift action and effective partnership in securing this positive outcome for the victim.



Earlier today on 13/02/2026, officers from Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team received a report via the Retail Radio network regarding a shop theft at the Co-Op on Long Street, Atherstone.

Following timely updates from store staff and the council CCTV network, officers conducted a short blue-light run to locate the vehicle involved. The car was successfully brought to a stop on the A5 in Grendon.

Two occupants were identified in possession of stolen items, which have now been recovered. Both individuals will be reported for the offences.

We would like to thank Co-Op staff and our partners within the council CCTV network for their vigilance and swift communication, which played a key role in bringing this incident to a safe and prompt conclusion.



Arrests and Outcomes

23/02/2026, officers from Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team, working alongside the North Warwickshire Rural Crime Team, recovered a Volkswagen Touareg in Hartshill.

The vehicle had already come to our attention after being linked to the theft of registration plates in the local area. It is also suspected to have been used in further criminal activity, and checks at the scene revealed that it had no valid tax or insurance. Thanks to the proactive work of both teams, the vehicle has now been removed from the roads and will be examined as part of ongoing enquiries. We continue to encourage residents to report suspicious vehicles, number-plate thefts, or unusual activity in their area. Your information helps us build a clearer picture and take action where it matters.



Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team would like to highlight the excellent work of our officers and partners following a report of theft from The Original Factory Shop on Long Street and Tesco on Station Street at around 1:15pm on 21/02/2026.

The total value of stolen goods was close to £1,000, and we're pleased to confirm that all recovered property has been returned to the stores.

Thanks to the vigilance of retail staff, the support of the local Retail Radio scheme, and the outstanding work of council CCTV operators, officers were able to quickly locate and detain the suspects.

One male has been arrested in connection with the incident, and a second individual has been dealt with outside of court.

This incident demonstrates the importance of partnership working between retailers, local authorities, and police in keeping our town centres safe. We'd like to thank everyone involved for their quick actions and continued support.



North Warwickshire Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) proposed and owned a problem-solving plan focused on The Bell Inn in Coleshill.

This was a good plan designed to reduce anti-social behaviour (ASB) and violence associated with the pub. It had been the location of repeat incidents of ASB, disorder and serious violence over a period, including a stabbing. Initial attempts to engage with the licensee proved fruitless and public trust and confidence was impacted.

This plan incorporated proactive policing operations, targeted patrols, licensing checks and community meetings. The most impactful response was the licensing work; the SNT worked with PS Martin Hewish to bring forward a licensing review and ultimately secured a closure of the premises. When a temporary closure was imposed, this resulted in the owners changing their operating model and introducing a new licensee.

Research shows this licensing intervention has been a success: **between 17 September 2025 and 29 January 2026 there were no crimes recorded at The Bell Inn.** This is a reduction of 100% (-7 Crimes) in recorded crime when compared to the same period the previous year. Since September 2025 there have been no calls for service from this location at all.

This plan was graded Good with a score of 70%, due to its success in reducing serious incidents of violence and anti-social behaviour and improving the lives of the local community. Well done North Warwickshire SNT and PS Martin Hewish!

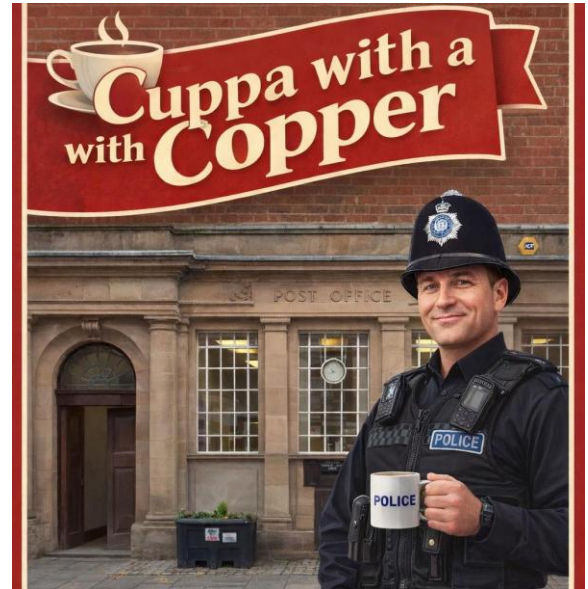

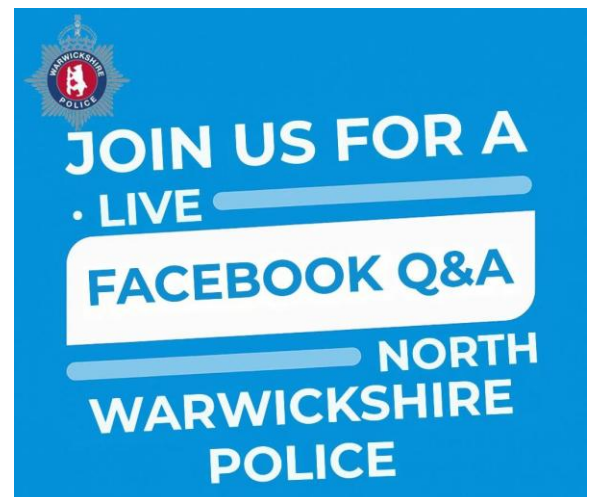

Theft from cars is one of the local policing teams priorities.

We have made numerous linked arrests recently and conducted various operations but one of the main targets for criminals is unlocked vehicles.

Please make sure your vehicle and property are secure.



Community Speed Watch

PCSO Yaqub has been training volunteers for speed watch this month.

This month, the speed watch teams have been out conducting speed checks in the villages. The community speed watch groups are a valued part of our communities. E-Scooters

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of 'powered transporters'. This covers a range of personal transport devices that are powered by a motor.

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. This means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters including the need to have a licence and insurance. There are two ways of using an e-scooter:

- by privately owning one
- by renting one through an authorised rental scheme

Owning your own e-scooter

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres. If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance. If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter, the incident will be investigated in the same way it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car. Where you can use your own e-scooter: If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it in on private land, such as in a garden. But you must have the permission of the landowner to do so.

Vehicle Crime

Do you have a keyless entry vehicle?

Thieves can steal your keyless vehicle by hijacking and amplifying the signal from your start device (key) in order to start your vehicle.

Help to protect your vehicle by:

- Make sure your vehicle is properly locked/secure and keep your key away from doors and windows. This will reduce the chance of criminals amplifying the signal.
- Some keys have a function allowing them to be turned off. Check your manual to see if yours does and then use it.
- Use some kind of physical barrier such as a steering wheel lock (preferably a disk lock), instal a driving parking post or use a wheel clamp. This will deter many criminals as it will be time consuming for them to move the vehicle.
- Fit a tracking device into your vehicle.
- Keep your keys in a Faraday bag to block the signal to your keys.
- Remove batteries from your spare key or put them in a separate Faraday pouch.

And remember to be on the lookout for people acting suspiciously and report it by calling 999!

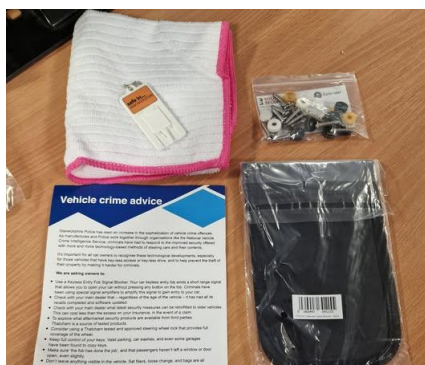
PCSO Mitchell and PCSO Smith have been out distributing faraday pouches.

These have been distributed around some of our high targeted areas. The pouches have very kindly been purchased by North Warwickshire Borough Council, in our steps to tackling vehicle crime.

We believe a joint approach is key when tackling crime. We have received lots of great comments from residents, many of whom we have been able to offer lots of crime prevention information to.

Initial police response to vehicle crime.

Initial call managed by either LPRC or control room and if the incident is live and ongoing seek immediate deployment.

During the initial contact, the call taker will provide reassurance and discuss all investigative opportunities such as CCTV, Witnesses, Forensic opportunities with the victim or witness.

These questions and responses will be documented on the Strom log, and an investigation is then created.

Call taker will provide scene preservation advice to the victim.

Should there be no investigative opportunities the investigation will be sent to the CCC to complete and record a review and ensure that all investigative opportunities have been considered.

At this stage a decision will be made to either file the investigation if there are no further opportunities to pursue a positive outcome or allocate to an officer with an action plan should further potential investigative opportunities exist to seek a positive outcome.
