Operations

OP Town Safe

OP YARD – What It Is and Why It Matters

Operation Yard is a targeted policing initiative focused on reducing HGV-related crime at motorway service stations and freight hubs. These locations are essential rest points for drivers, but they're also vulnerable to offences such as fuel theft, load interference, vehicle break-ins, and organised criminal activity.

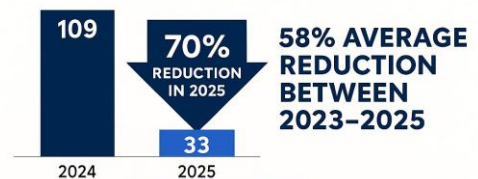
The purpose of Operation Yard is to:

- Protect HGV drivers and their cargo.
- Identify and disrupt offenders operating around service stations.
- Increase visibility and reassurance in high-risk areas.
- Gather intelligence linked to freight crime and organised networks.
- Work with partner agencies and service-station operators to improve safety.

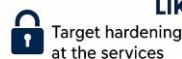
Officers conduct patrols, speak with drivers, check vehicles linked to intelligence, and monitor behaviour around the services to spot early signs of criminal activity. By focusing on the places where HGV drivers rest and refuel, Operation Yard aims to keep the road network safer, prevent costly thefts, and support those who play a vital role in keeping goods moving across the country.

Stolen e-Bike: Recovered from Coleshill

Officers from Atherstone & Coleshill Police and Warwickshire Rural Crime Team have recovered a stolen e-bike following a theft reported in the Hams Hall area of Coleshill yesterday evening on 5th March 2026.

The bike was taken from a business premises between approximately 20:00hrs and 21:00hrs. Officers were provided with information about a suspect vehicle believed to have been involved in the incident.

Following ANPR enquiries, the vehicle was traced to the Lea Hall area, where officers attended and located the stolen e-bike inside a property. By 22:45hrs the bike had been secured by Police and returned to the owner.

A male from the address has been spoken to in connection with the offence, and enquiries remain ongoing as part of the investigation.

We would like to thank colleagues from West Midlands Police for their assistance in helping bring this incident to a swift resolution.



You can ride a privately owned e-bike in public without a licence if you are over fourteen, but it must meet certain requirements.

They must have a maximum power output of 250 watts and a maximum speed of 15.5mph.

They also must be pedal assisted, meaning you must pedal for the motor to kick in, rather than simply pressing a button or twisting a throttle.

If they do not meet these criteria, they are classed as a motorbike or moped so must be registered, taxed, and insured, while riders must hold a licence or wear a helmet.

Police have powers to seize e-scooters and e-bikes that do not comply under Section 1658A of the Road Traffic Act 1988, having a vehicle on the road without insurance.

The offence can result in a criminal prosecution, typically attracting six penalty points when dealt with in court, however it is dealt with simply by way of seizure.

If you witness someone riding an off-road bike in an antisocial manner, please report them through the QR code below.

As many may have experienced within the local community, the rise in Anti-social behaviour involving a large number of motorbikes.

Most of these bikes are driven illegally without insurance and pose a danger to the community. Therefore, we need to encourage the community to inform of us of these concerns with as much information as possible so we can get these bikes off the streets and crushed.

We can also issue the driver a Section 59 which grants us the powers to seize and remove vehicles that are being used to cause alarm, distress, or annoyance, careless or inconsiderate manner and off-road driving, this will last for 12 months. A section 59 also applies to both the driver and the vehicle so even if someone else drives the same vehicle in an anti-social manner, we can still enforce it.

Operation Rosepool – Tackling Off-Road Bike ASB

On 12/03/2026, officers in North Warwickshire recovered a blue Yamaha NMAX 125 in Hartshill. Checks confirmed the moped had been stolen from Burton on 11/03/2026, and it has now been secured for further enquiries and return to its owner.

This recovery is another example of our ongoing work to tackle vehicle-related crime across the district.

Operation Rosepool

Over the next few weeks, Operation Rosepool will be intensifying activity across North Warwickshire to target the anti-social use of motorcycles and off-road vehicles. Expect increased patrols, targeted enforcement, and partnership work aimed at reducing nuisance riding and associated offending.

On the 28/02/2026 Late night to early morning patrols have been carried out by PCSO Scott around residential and industrial estates in Atherstone town centre to combat car keyless thefts and burglaries.

Patrols have also been conducted around the M42 and M6 Corley services HGV parking bays to deter freight theft.

02/03/2026 officers from Atherstone SNT recovered this BMW from Florence Close after concerns were raised about it being driven around the town with no insurance, tax or mot.



On the afternoon of 02/03/2026, thanks to the vigilance of our local community, officers from Atherstone were able to recover a vehicle that had been stolen from Nuneaton last night.

After a member of the public reported a suspicious-looking vehicle, our officers quickly attended and confirmed it had been stolen. We're pleased to say the owner has now been notified and will soon be reunited with his vehicle.

This is a great example of how important the public are in helping us keep our communities safe. Your calls, your information, and your willingness to speak up really do make a difference.

05/03/2026 Over the past 2 days and nights, North Warwickshire PCSOs have been out on foot delivering faraday pouches and warnings to residents regarding the recent vehicle thefts. We have issued pouches to over 350 houses in Atherstone and the surrounding villages.

Late night/early hour patrols are now being continued by SNT officers to deter criminality and respond to any suspicious activity.



Bobbies on the Beat Atherstone

On morning of 06/03/2026 this stolen car from Walsall was found in Tamworth after PCSO Scott received information from a vigilant member of public raising concerns about the vehicle. Working with Tamworth, Staffs police details were given of its location and officers deployed and the vehicle safely recovered.



PCSO 6098 Hodson & 6162 Scott have been out conducting early morning patrols on the 20/03/2026 engaging with van drivers offering security advice due to a spate of van thefts between the borders of Staffordshire & Warwickshire. Hi visibility patrols were also conducted through several villages in the North including new housing estates currently under building construction.



10/03/2026 Officers from the Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team, working alongside the Northern Rural Crime Team, have successfully recovered a stolen vehicle following a report made this morning.

Thanks to a swift response from our officers, the vehicle was located and recovered within 30 minutes of the reported stolen from Ash Green. It was recovered just over the border in Chelmsley Wood. The vehicle has been forensically recovered and will now be examined in due course as part of ongoing enquiries.

This result highlights the importance of reporting suspicious activity or crime as soon as possible. Your information helps us respond quickly and increases the chances of recovering stolen property.

If you see anything suspicious in your area, please report it to us via 101, or 999 in an emergency.

Together, we can help keep our communities in Atherstone, Coleshill and the surrounding rural areas safe.



On the 19/03/2026 within the first 5 minutes of foot patrol this morning by PCSO Scott a male was stopped in a vehicle on Market Street, Atherstone.

The driver who is connected to a shop in the town was spoken to and small amount of counterfeit tobacco was seized from the vehicle.

Our colleagues in trading standards have been updated and will continue with their investigations regarding the male and shop.

We are aware of the impact these businesses are having in Atherstone town centre, and we are working with Trading Standards and the landlord of the building who has no other connections to the town centre.

After lending a hand and a short time working together, we're happy to say the ambulance was back up and running and soon on its way to its next call.

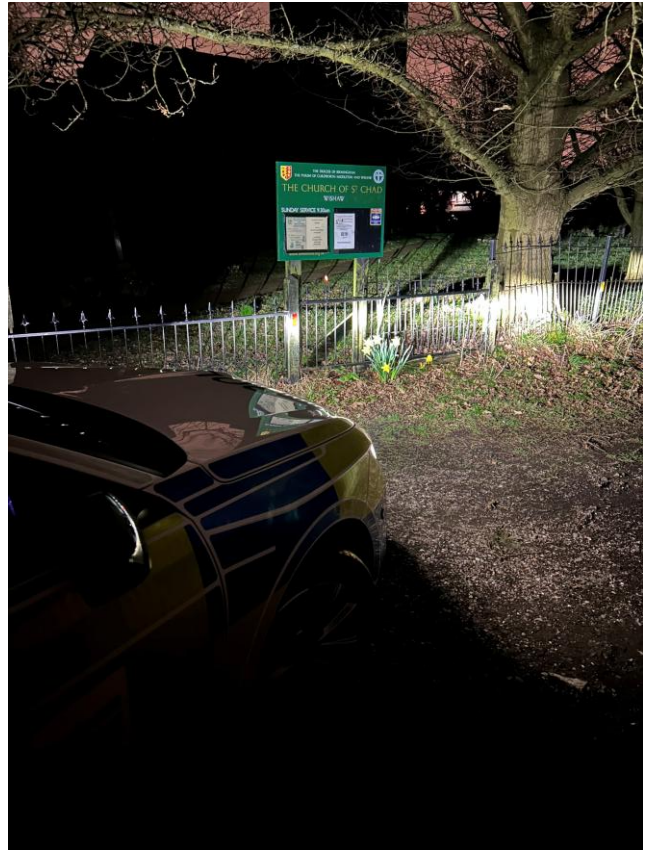


On the 02/03/2026 early morning patrols conducted by PCSO Yaqub from Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team following recent reports of vehicle crime and suspicious incidents in the area. Patrols were conducted at Coleshill, Shustoke, Maxstoke, Fillongley, Corley, Corley Moor, Corley Services, New Arley and Old Arley.



On the evening of 02/03/2026, PCSO Mitchell was out on patrol across the Coleshill West patch.

High-visibility patrols were carried out to help deter anti-social behaviour and vehicle crime, keeping our community safe and reassured.



On the 04/03/2026 PC Breeze and PCSO Yaqub from Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team have been out on foot patrol around Coleshill. We also met the Coleshill Town Counsellors and the Mayor of Coleshill to discuss local community issues.



Bobbies on the Beat Coleshill

05/03/2026 PCSO Yaqub from Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team visited victims of burglary incidents, also distributed faraday pouches. Patrols were also conducted at Coleshill, Shustoke, Maxstoke, Over Whitacre, Old Arley, Ansley Village, Astley, Fillongley, Corley and Corley Moor.



On the afternoon of 23/03/2026 PC 2300 Thompson from Coleshill safer neighbourhood team has been out patrolling various area on the patch: - Patrols were conducted in Kingsbury including Kingsbury waterpark following the report of a robbery incident at the weekend, these patrols will continue a regular basis as this location is a cause for concern for off road bikes. - High visibility patrols have been conducted In Bassetts Pole following an attempt robbery taking place in the area recently. - House visits have been made to residents in Coleshill after a theft of motor vehicle occurred in Colemeadow Road on Saturday 21st March. Security items including faraday pouches and alarms were given out and patrols will continue in the area as we understand the concerns that incidents like this can cause to residents. Thank you to all those who took time to speak to officers when out on patrol today in local villages.



16/03/2026 Early hours patrols have been carried out overnight at Corley services HGV parks by Coleshill Safer Neighbourhood Team. Patrols are occurring on a regular basis in the location as we look to tackle issues that HGV drivers have had at the services in recent years.



On the 24/03/2026 Officers from Coleshill SNT was dealing with a tree that has fallen into the road on Trinity Road, Kingsbury, please take caution when driving in the area.



Arrests and Outcomes

01/03/2026 Working with local stores through the retail radio and through the town CCTV a shop lifter has been charged with two offences of shop theft one at the Co-op Atherstone and the other at Morrisons Atherstone. They will now have to attend court.



A male has been charged with possession Class C with intent to wrongful inhale after been found with a number of NITROUS cannisters and balloons by police in Atherstone. The male will now be put before the court. This was located after street cleaning teams from **North Warwickshire Borough Council** reported high number of the cannisters been dumped in a car park.



During the attempt to stop the off-road bike, one of our officers sustained injuries while trying to apprehend the rider. The officer is receiving support and is expected to recover.

Enquiries remain ongoing to identify the rider involved. The pillion passenger, a 15-year-old, has been interviewed. Due to their age, diversionary action will be taken in relation to the possession of cannabis, alongside appropriate safeguarding measures.

We are asking residents to check any CCTV, doorbell cameras, or dash-cam footage that may have captured two youths on an off-road bike in or around New Street, Baddesley at approximately 13:15hrs on 21/03/2026. If you have any footage or information that may assist our investigation, please contact us quoting INC 169 – 21/03/26.

Operation Rosepool

At the time of the incident, officers were carrying out proactive patrols as part of Operation Rosepool, North Warwickshire's targeted operation to tackle anti-social and nuisance off-road bike use. Over the coming weeks, you will see increased patrols, targeted enforcement, and intelligence-led activity across the district.

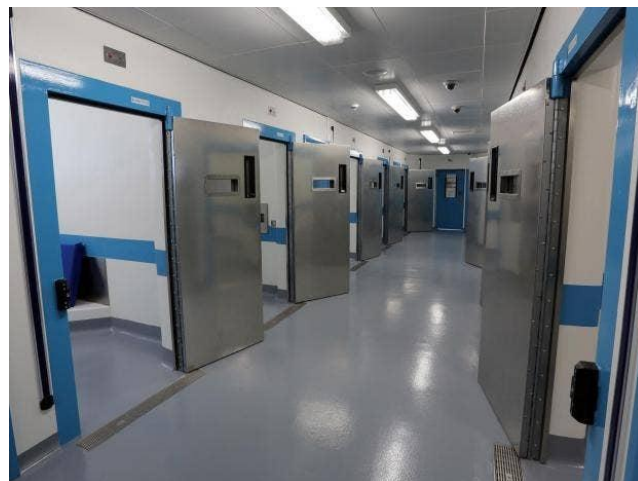

A warrant has taken place at two addresses in the Hartshill area early morning of the 03/03/2026. Two people are in custody currently on suspicion of supplying drugs.



10/03/2026 Officers were called after a two-vehicle collision in Wishaw at around midnight.

Upon arrival police have conducted beath test checks and drugs swipe procedure at the scene with one driver testing positive for drugs.

The driver has been arrested and is presently in custody.



A male is still in custody the morning after being arrested yesterday 18/03/2026 at approximately 16:50 hours on Wishaw Lane on suspicion of drink driving.

The male whom has not been arrested previously was involved in a single vehicle RTC and provided a breath test reading of 111 (legal limit is 35.....)

Male will be interviewed, likely charged and a court appearance incoming.

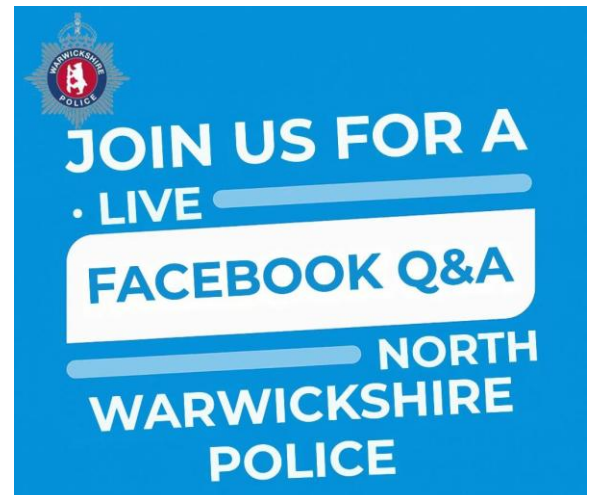

We have made numerous linked arrests recently and conducted various operations but one of the main targets for criminals is unlocked vehicles.

Community Speed Watch

PCSO Yaqub has been training volunteers for speed watch this month.

This month, the speed watch teams have been out conducting speed checks in the villages. The community speed watch groups are a valued part of our communities. E-Scooters

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of 'powered transporters'. This covers a range of personal transport devices that are powered by a motor.

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. This means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters including the need to have a licence and insurance. There are two ways of using an e-scooter:

- by privately owning one
- by renting one through an authorised rental scheme

Owning your own e-scooter

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres. If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance. If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter, the incident will be investigated in the same way it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car. Where you can use your own e-scooter: If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it in on private land, such as in a garden. But you must have the permission of the landowner to do so.

Vehicle Crime

Do you have a keyless entry vehicle?

Thieves can steal your keyless vehicle by hijacking and amplifying the signal from your start device (key) in order to start your vehicle.

Help to protect your vehicle by:

- Make sure your vehicle is properly locked/secure and keep your key away from doors and windows. This will reduce the chance of criminals amplifying the signal.
- Some keys have a function allowing them to be turned off. Check your manual to see if yours does and then use it.
- Use some kind of physical barrier such as a steering wheel lock (preferably a disk lock), instal a driving parking post or use a wheel clamp. This will deter many criminals as it will be time consuming for them to move the vehicle.
- Fit a tracking device into your vehicle.
- Keep your keys in a Faraday bag to block the signal to your keys.
- Remove batteries from your spare key or put them in a separate Faraday pouch.

And remember to be on the lookout for people acting suspiciously and report it by calling 999!

The Atherstone & Coleshill safer neighbourhood teams have been delivering faraday pouches.

These have been distributed around some of our high targeted areas. The pouches have very kindly been purchased by North Warwickshire Borough Council, in our steps to tackling vehicle crime.

We believe a joint approach is key when tackling crime. We have received lots of great comments from residents, many of whom we have been able to offer lots of crime prevention information to.

Initial police response to vehicle crime.

Initial call managed by either LPRC or control room and if the incident is live and ongoing seek immediate deployment.

During the initial contact, the call taker will provide reassurance and discuss all investigative opportunities such as CCTV, Witnesses, Forensic opportunities with the victim or witness.

These questions and responses will be documented on the Strom log, and an investigation is then created.

Call taker will provide scene preservation advice to the victim.

Should there be no investigative opportunities the investigation will be sent to the CCC to complete and record a review and ensure that all investigative opportunities have been considered.

At this stage a decision will be made to either file the investigation if there are no further opportunities to pursue a positive outcome or allocate to an officer with an action plan should further potential investigative opportunities exist to seek a positive outcome.
