Operations



Operation Corton -

We are carrying out an operation to tackle the illegal use and sale of nitrous oxide.

Inhaling nitrous oxide carries a range of health risks and is against the law. It is also a significant contributor to antisocial behaviour, and we are increasingly seeing cases of people driving while under its influence – in some instances with fatal consequences.

If you have information about where nitrous oxide is being used (discarded canisters are often a clear sign) or where it is being sold illegally, please report it.

Your reports help us plan targeted patrols and focus our efforts where they are most needed.

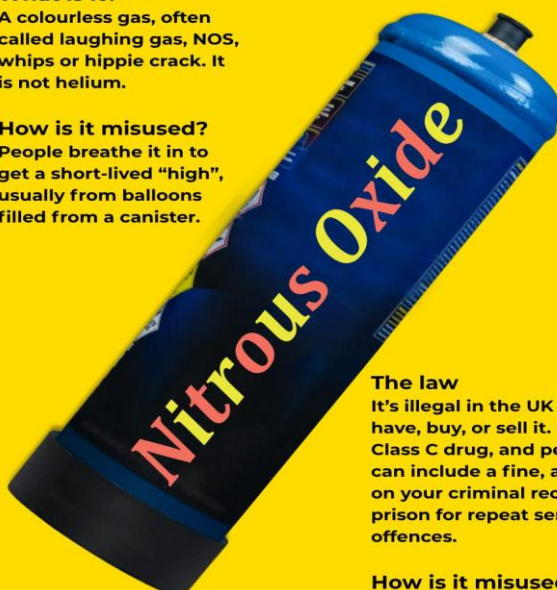
Know the facts

What is it?

A colourless gas, often called laughing gas, NOS, whips or hippie crack. It is not helium.

How is it misused?

People breathe it in to get a short-lived "high", usually from balloons filled from a canister.



The law

It's illegal in the UK to make, have, buy, or sell it. It's a Class C drug, and penalties can include a fine, a caution on your criminal record, or prison for repeat serious offences.

How is it misused?

People breathe it in to get a short-lived "high", usually from balloons filled from a canister.

OP YARD – What It Is and Why It Matters

Operation Yard is a targeted policing initiative focused on reducing HGV-related crime at motorway service stations and freight hubs. These locations are essential rest points for drivers, but they're also vulnerable to offences such as fuel theft, load interference, vehicle break-ins, and organised criminal activity.

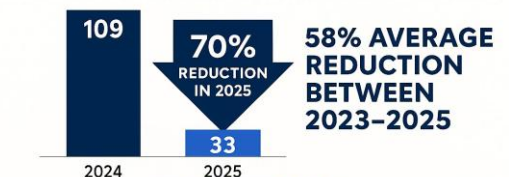
The purpose of Operation Yard is to:

- Protect HGV drivers and their cargo.
- Identify and disrupt offenders operating around service stations.
- Increase visibility and reassurance in high-risk areas.
- Gather intelligence linked to freight crime and organised networks.
- Work with partner agencies and service-station operators to improve safety.

Officers conduct patrols, speak with drivers, check vehicles linked to intelligence, and monitor behaviour around the services to spot early signs of criminal activity. By focusing on the places where HGV drivers rest and refuel, Operation Yard aims to keep the road network safer, prevent costly thefts, and support those who play a vital role in keeping goods moving across the country.

E-Scooters:-

You can ride a privately owned e-bike in public without a licence if you are over fourteen, but it must meet certain requirements.

They must have a maximum power output of 250 watts and a maximum speed of 15.5mph.

They also must be pedal assisted, meaning you must pedal for the motor to kick in, rather than simply pressing a button or twisting a throttle.

If they do not meet these criteria, they are classed as a motorbike or moped so must be registered, taxed, and insured, while riders must hold a licence or wear a helmet.

Police have powers to seize e-scooters and e-bikes that do not comply under Section 1658A of the Road Traffic Act 1988, having a vehicle on the road without insurance.

The offence can result in a criminal prosecution, typically attracting six penalty points when dealt with in court, however it is dealt with simply by way of seizure.

Operation Rosepool – Tackling Off-Road Bike ASB

Operation Rosepool is a dedicated policing operation focused on tackling **anti-social behaviour involving off-road bikes**. We know how disruptive illegal, or irresponsible off-road bike use can be to our communities — from noise and intimidation to damage of parks, fields, and public spaces.

Through Op Rosepool, officers are working proactively to:

- **Identify and target** individuals using off-road bikes illegally or dangerously
- **Seize uninsured or unroadworthy bikes**
- **Increase patrols in hotspot areas**
- **Gather intelligence** from the community to support enforcement
- **Work with partners** to reduce long-term harm and keep public spaces safe

Our aim is simple: **to reduce harm, prevent anti-social behaviour, and protect communities** from the ongoing issues caused by nuisance off-road bikes. If you have information that could support Operation Rosepool, please report it via our usual channels. Your information helps us take action.

As many may have experienced within the local community, the rise in **Anti-social behaviour** involving a large number of **motorbikes**.

Most of these bikes are driven illegally without insurance and pose a danger to the community. Therefore, we need to encourage the community to inform us of these concerns with as much information as possible so we can get these bikes off the streets and crushed.

We can also issue the driver a Section 59 which grants us the powers to seize and remove vehicles that are being used to cause alarm, distress, or annoyance, careless or inconsiderate manner and off-road driving, this will last for 12 months. A section 59 also applies to both the driver and the vehicle so even if someone else drives the same vehicle in an anti-social manner, we can still enforce it.

Stolen Motorcycles - Recovered in Atherstone

Officers from Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) and the Warwickshire Rural Crime Team have successfully recovered two stolen motorcycles in Atherstone this afternoon.

At 12:53hrs on 01/04/2026, we received a report of a motorcycle theft from an address overnight in Hurley. Thanks to swift action by officers and valuable information provided by the victim, not one, but two stolen motorcycles were located and recovered in under ninety minutes!

Both owners have now been notified, and enquiries into the circumstances surrounding the thefts are ongoing.

01/05/2026 Officers from Atherstone SNT were responding to reports of a stolen motorbike when suspects were spotted riding an electric bike. Despite efforts to locate them, they managed to evade capture.

While this was ongoing, a member of the public reported finding a motorbike, it turned out to be the same bike officers were looking for. Officers attended and were able to recover the vehicle.

Thanks to the information provided, there is now a strong opportunity for the bike to be returned to its rightful owner. We'd like to thank the member of the public for their vigilance and support – your information really does make a difference. 03/05/2026 Officers from Atherstone SNT have recovered a vehicle this afternoon suspected to be involved in fuel thefts from HS2 sites in Coleshill. The driver and passenger, both white males, have fled the scene prior to police arrival. Enquiries are being made in relation to an abandoned red, Peugeot 207 located nearby to the site.



02/05/2026 Atherstone Officers whilst out through the night have spotted this van been driven in the early hours. Concerned it may be stolen officers have stopped the vehicle. Unfortunately for the driver checks have shown they are not insured and don't have a licence, so the vehicle was seized by police.



06/05/2026 PCSO Rygielski attended Ratcliffe road Youth group.

I was made extremely welcome by Charlotte, Justin and all the kids who were there.

10/05/2026 Early morning patrols around Atherstone town centre by PCSO Scott found this vehicle insecure with shopping bags on display. Bobbies on the Beat

02/05/2026 Over the weekend on both Friday and Saturday, PC 2300 Thompson and PC 1372 Breeze have been patrolling various locations dealing with local issues that have been brought to our attention from residents.

Patrols have been carried out in Water Orton on Friday and Saturday evening due to concerns from residents regarding parking in the area. A handful of cars were parked incorrectly which was dealt with appropriately, local businesses in the area were spoken too by officers regarding the work we are doing to try and reduce the parking issues in the area.

High visibility patrols have been carried out in Coleshill alongside other local villages including Shustoke and Wishaw late at night into the early hours.



On the evening of 12/05/2026 PC 2300 Thompson and SGT 671 Skelsey have been out on area patrolling locations that have been highlighted to us regarding the use of nitrous oxide. These patrols are part of OP CORTON which will be conducted on a regular basis as we look to take action against the use of nitrous oxide in our communities, it is often that users under the influence then proceed to drive in the area putting others at serious risk.

This evening the following locations have been patrolled:

- Maud Road Garages - Water Orton
- B4116 layby
- Packington Lane, Coleshill
- Fillongley
- Carlyon Industrial estate, Atherstone
- Leather Mill Lane, Hartshill
- Twenty-One Oaks Road, Bentley

Whilst out conducting patrols officers were flagged down by staff members at a local licensed premises in Coleshill due to a male inside the pub refusing to leave, this incident was dealt with swiftly causing very little disturbance the pub staff and customers.



10/05/2026 After concerns have been raised about motor vehicles being present on the field of Royal Meadow drive patrols and engagement have been carried out this afternoon.

A clearer picture of some of the concerns residents have raised will allow more targeted patrols of the area to be carried out.

On the afternoon of 13/05/2026 PC 2300 Thompson from Coleshill safer neighbourhood team has patrolled Wishaw village. Today, PC Thompson met with a local councillor from the area where both patrolled the village together to highlight and discuss key hotspot locations in regard to ASB and fly tipping.

13/05/2026 whilst on duty PC 2300 Thompson and PC 1372 Breeze were alerted via the town retail radio of a theft which had occurred at a local store in Coleshill. Officers responded to the incident on foot and located suspects in relation to the offence shortly after it was reported.

We are now working alongside the store to take the most appropriate form of action, great result and successful use of the retail radio's which have recently been introduced to Coleshill town.



22/05/2026 officers from Atherstone Police attended a report of an abandoned motorbike. Upon arrival, officers located the vehicle in a ditch and, following checks, discovered that the VIN number had been deliberately ground off. The motorbike was recovered and removed from circulation—preventing it from being used for criminal activity.



Later in the shift, officers conducted proactive patrols across the villages of North Warwickshire. During these patrols, a vehicle was spotted that appeared out of place. Further checks were completed, which revealed the vehicle was displaying false number plates.



16/05/2026 Regular patrols are still on-going at Birch Coppice Business Park and Core 42 following recent motorbike thefts onsite.



18/05/2026 Atherstone SNT were doing patrols in and around North Warwickshire. When a ford focus came flying through Warton, words of advice regarding speed were going to be used to educate the young driver. But he fancied a game of tig instead. The vehicle was on cloned plates and enquires are on-going into who the driver of this vehicle was. Late night patrols around ASB hot points were conducted in Hartshill, Polesworth and Warton that same evening.



26/05/2026 PC 2300 Thompson and PC 2074 Pedley were made aware of a suspicious vehicle parked in Piccadilly. Officers attended the location and after conducting further checks the vehicle came back as stolen, the vehicle has been recovered for examination. Thank you to local members of the community who brought this to our attention.



Arrests and Outcomes

21/05/2026 A local male has been dealt with by local officers in regard to a series of graffiti offences that has occurred in the Coleshill area over the past few weeks. The male has been positively dealt with via a programme called community resolution with various conditions for him to complete including cleaning some of the affected areas and an apology to the property owners. He has also been served a notice where he is forbidden to be in possession of spray paint/marker pens in a public place. We also wish to express special thanks to local Cllr Fowler who in his own time has been cleaning off some of the affected areas and to the local community providing valuable community intelligence in obtaining the identity of the offender.



Officers from trading standards on Saturday 22/05/2026 again visited Atherstone and had a further test purchase of counterfeit cigarettes. As a result, an inspection was then carried out at the store and found 134 packets of illegal cigarettes and 20 packets of hand rolling tobacco hidden in an old hide in the metal door. The shop keeper and landlord will be dealt with for the offences by trading standards. This store is a different premises to the shop in Atherstone High Street that has recently been forced to close to similar issues. Officers will continue to address these concerns and will utilise powers to shut the shops with heavy fines for the operators.



25/06/2026, Kingsbury Water Park on Bodymoor Heath Lane. we can confirm that sadly the body of a teenage girl was recovered from the water shortly after 7.20pm. Despite the efforts of emergency services, she was pronounced deceased at the scene. Her next of kin has been informed and they're being supported by specially trained officers. Over the coming days, we'll have officers in the area providing reassurance, so if you have any questions, please speak to them. An investigation into the circumstances has begun and we'd ask people to avoid speculation what has happened. Our thoughts remain with her family and friends during this difficult time.



Arrests and Outcomes

11/05/2026 Police have been contacted through the retail radio in relation to a suspected drink driver, due to the quick report police have been able to stop the vehicle and have arrested the driver on suspicion of drink drive, the suspect was taken to custody and has been blown over the prescribed legal limit, they will be spending some time in police cells until they have sobered up to be charged.

We would like to thank the retail users for their help in getting this person stopped as they were driving around as schools were leaving.



The evening of 14/05/2026 we have issued two Section 59 Notices to two persons riding anti-socially in Atherstone during May 2026.

Thanks to the public's help, we have been able to identify two riders and two vehicles linked to anti-social vehicle use around Royal Meadow Drive recreation ground.

Whilst both riders and vehicles are legally owned and insured, the riders on this occasion were riding in a manner that was careless and inconsiderate to other members of the public, as well as causing a nuisance. We need your help to be the extra eyes and ears, and this is a great example of how the public can help us tackle anti-social vehicle use by reporting via the Dob Em In scheme or typical police channels.

On 07/05/26 Atherstone town CCTV operators were made aware of an attempt trolley push of groceries from the Co-op supermarket on Longstreet via the retail radio.

Thanks to the vigilance of staff the items were quickly recovered.

CCTV operators tracked the offenders in Silver VW Golf leaving through the town as it exited on to the A5. With the vehicle registration details an action marker was placed on the vehicle which was stopped yesterday evening in the London area.

The driver was reported for a number of offences and the vehicle seized.



On 8 January this year, two PCSOs from the Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team received an alert from the Atherstone Council CCTV team that a man was selling cigarettes from his car.

The PCSOs intercepted the car – a white Ford Fiesta driven by Ajet Rama, 52 - which stopped at the local bus station.

Inside the car, they discovered cigarettes – alongside deal bags of cocaine in the glovebox.

They called for assistance, and on the arrival of police constables, a full search of the car revealed more cocaine, a logbook of sales, and two boxes worth of cannabis vape products.

Further searches of Rama's home were carried out where an estimated three kilo block of cocaine was discovered, along with around 10 kilos of cannabis leaf.

Ajet Rama, 52 of Old Forge Road, Fenny Drayton, was sentenced to three years in prison at Warwick Crown Court for possession of cannabis with intent to supply, and possession of cocaine with intent to supply. Rama is also required to pay a victim's surcharge of £228.

Investigating officer DC Blaney said "This is a great example of working together to tackle the problems in our communities – from eagle-eyed CCTV operators in the council to PCSOs out on the ground with deep community knowledge, to investigation teams using our expertise to get the case over the line. "Hopefully this result has shown Rama that he can't cruise around our communities selling drugs without being derailed."

Officers have been educating youths and pupils will be passing through the North Warwickshire Borough Council funded knife arch.

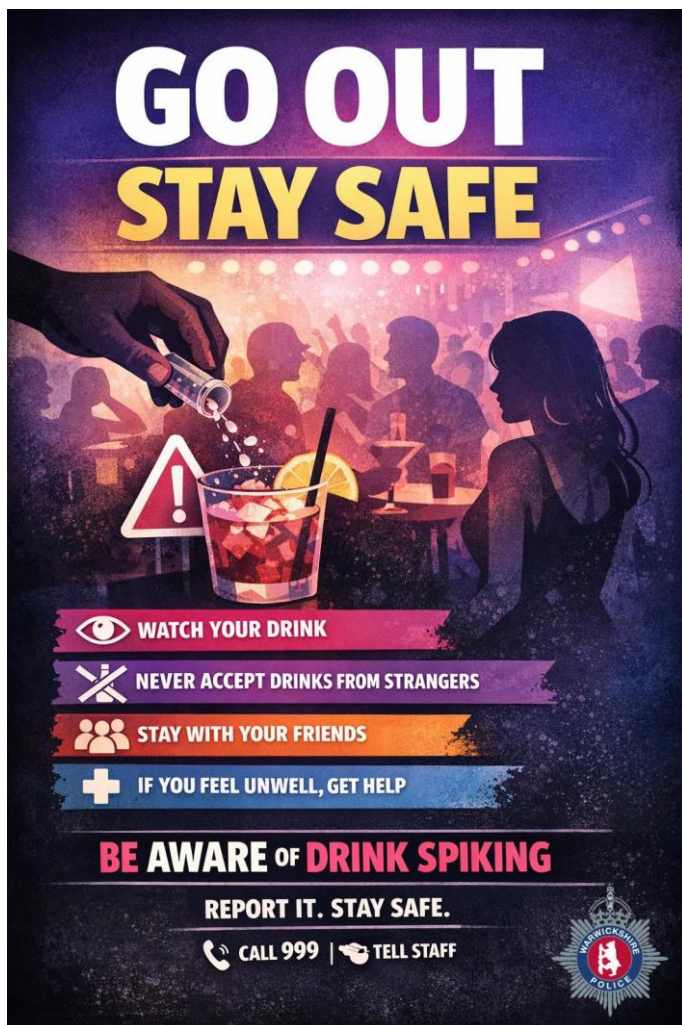

Community Speed Watch

PCSO Yaqub has been training volunteers for speed watch this month.

This month, the speed watch teams have been out conducting speed checks in the villages. The community speed watch groups are a valued part of our communities. E-Scooters

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of 'powered transporters'. This covers a range of personal transport devices that are powered by a motor.

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. This means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also apply to e-scooters including the need to have a licence and insurance. There are two ways of using an e-scooter:

- by privately owning one
- by renting one through an authorised rental scheme

Owning your own e-scooter

It's not currently possible to get insurance for privately owned e-scooters. This means it's illegal to use them on the road or in public spaces, such as parks, street pavements, and shopping centres. If you use a privately-owned e-scooter in public, you risk the vehicle being seized under S.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 for having no insurance. If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter, the incident will be investigated in the same way it would if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car. Where you can use your own e-scooter: If you own an e-scooter, you can only use it in on private land, such as in a garden. But you must have the permission of the landowner to do so.

Vehicle Crime

Do you have a keyless entry vehicle?

Thieves can steal your keyless vehicle by hijacking and amplifying the signal from your start device (key) in order to start your vehicle.

Help to protect your vehicle by:

- Make sure your vehicle is properly locked/secure and keep your key away from doors and windows. This will reduce the chance of criminals amplifying the signal.
- Some keys have a function allowing them to be turned off. Check your manual to see if yours does and then use it.
- Use some kind of physical barrier such as a steering wheel lock (preferably a disk lock), instal a driving parking post or use a wheel clamp. This will deter many criminals as it will be time consuming for them to move the vehicle.
- Fit a tracking device into your vehicle.
- Keep your keys in a Faraday bag to block the signal to your keys.
- Remove batteries from your spare key or put them in a separate Faraday pouch.

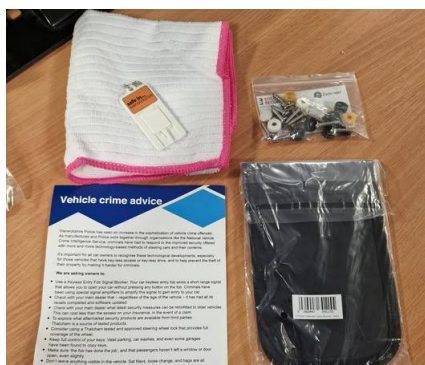
The Atherstone & Coleshill safer neighbourhood teams have been delivering faraday pouches.

These have been distributed around some of our high targeted areas. The pouches have very kindly been purchased by North Warwickshire Borough Council, in our steps to tackling vehicle crime.

We believe a joint approach is key when tackling crime. We have received lots of great comments from residents, many of whom we have been able to offer lots of crime prevention information to.

Initial police response to vehicle crime.

Initial call managed by either LPRC or control room and if the incident is live and ongoing seek immediate deployment.

During the initial contact, the call taker will provide reassurance and discuss all investigative opportunities such as CCTV, Witnesses, Forensic opportunities with the victim or witness.

These questions and responses will be documented on the Strom log, and an investigation is then created.

Call taker will provide scene preservation advice to the victim.

Should there be no investigative opportunities the investigation will be sent to the CCC to complete and record a review and ensure that all investigative opportunities have been considered.

At this stage a decision will be made to either file the investigation if there are no further opportunities to pursue a positive outcome or allocate to an officer with an action plan should further potential investigative opportunities exist to seek a positive outcome.



Facts:

- Keyless entry vehicles are twice as likely to be stolen.
- The average van carries up to £2500 worth of tools.
