Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 26th January 2025

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

ALCESTER

- Theft. Shop, Kinwarton Farm Road. Several youngsters have entered the shop and have stolen various items. They were challenged by staff and some of the items retrieved. Several males dressed in black, one of them was tall with a beard. 5.20pm Saturday 25th January. 0269 25/01/2025

POLICE CADET DROP-IN SESSION

With the recruitment window now open for aspiring police cadets in Warwickshire, a drop-in evening has been organised for prospective applicants to learn more about the scheme on Tuesday 4th February 2025.

One of our current cadets - 17-year-old Georgia - has written about her journey:

"I joined as a junior cadet in 2021. Since then, I've attended weekly sessions covering all aspects of the police force which are very insightful and engaging.

"Cadet sessions are very interactive and allow for anyone to participate and join in.

They expand your life skills and encourage you to step outside of your comfort zone with the support of cadet



leaders and peers.

"The scheme has provided lots of volunteering opportunities, allowing me to meet people from all different backgrounds. Being a cadet has become an important aspect of my life and has really allowed me to mature as a person. I am now the High Sheriff cadet, which cadets can aspire to achieve in their final year.

"Cadets has been the best four years of my life and has given me some lifelong friends who I wouldn't have met otherwise. If anyone is thinking of applying, I'd say go for it!"

The police cadets are a scheme for 13–16-year-olds who live or go to school in Warwickshire, which offers them an opportunity to gain a practical understanding of policing, develop their spirit of adventure and good citizenship. Applications are now open until 28 February.
