Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 30th March 2025

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Some simple crime prevention advice for the warmer weather

As the weather gets better, we would like to remind residents of simple crime prevention tips that are often forgotten in sunny weather but can also make you vulnerable to theft.

- Always close and lock your doors and windows, even if you're just going into your back garden as you may not hear someone coming through an open window or door at the front.
- Make sure any valuables are left out of sight in your house and shed.
- Keep keys, money and bags away from the letterbox or cat flaps as thieves can hook valuables through small spaces.
- Lock sheds and garages, preferably not using a lock that burglars could use a screwdriver to open.
- Lock your bike inside a secure shed or garage, or to a robust fitting bolted to the ground or wall.
- If out in the evening or overnight, shut curtains and use a timer to automatically turn lights on at night.
- Don't advertise that you are away from home on social media- this could tell a burglar that you're not home.
