Out and about with Bedworth East SNT

This month, SNT have had an increasing number of reports regarding the issue around school parking and the safety of our youngsters when on the school run. We have put in place a rolling rota in which every day, Bedworth SNT target one school to try and encourage people to be considerate with their parking. We have seen brilliant improvements, with the amount of tickets being issued decreasing each day. We will continue to do this to provide a positive presence around schools and to ensure the safety of school children.

Our attention has been focussed recently on anti-social behaviour that has been taking place around the Bedworth train station. We have been working with the British Transport Police to identify the individuals responsible and also be seen in and around the area to deter any further incidents occurring.

We are continuing our efforts to support the Government guidelines regarding Covid19 and ensure that we are staying safe and following the rules as best we can. In trying times, we must all remember to pull together and do our bit to assist the tier system to progress through this pandemic. Bedworth SNT have been responding to a number of reports where these guidelines have been breached.

Speeding is a frequent problem in our community, which we are very aware of and are keen to keep on top of. We are very appreciative of the feedback we receive from residents that inform us of the areas where this is most evident. We have conducted speed checks in certain areas around Bedworth and endeavour to continue this into the New Year.

Update on our priorities:

2020 Priorities for Bedworth East SNT:

- As we head into the festive period, we are mindful of those people have been separated from their families or perhaps do not have relatives or loved one to celebrate this year. We are going to be finding some charitable initiatives that we can engage in as a team to remind those individuals that their Safer Neighbourhood Team is there for them.
- Out and about on patrols, we have been keeping an eye on our non-human residents of Bedworth. SNT officers assisted with herding a few cows that had escaped a field. We are pleased to report that they were very compliant with Police orders and were successfully moo-ved back into their field.
- Bedworth East also found another cannabis grow in an address in William Street. Officers quickly and efficiently emptied the premises and destroyed the plants. Investigations are ongoing.

Vehicle Crime



Bedworth East SNT have noticed a rise in vehicle crime in the past few months. This includes theft of items within a motor vehicle, theft of a motor vehicle or vandalism to a vehicle. On Friday 27th November, we conducted some vehicle checks which involved patrolling our streets of Bedworth, trying car doors to see which cars had been left insecure. The owner was then notified so that they were made aware of the potential consequences. Out of 95 cars checked, only 4 were found to be insecure. Great result!

DON'T WASTE YOUR HARD EARNED CASH

As we approach Christmas, it is the time for celebration and giving. Here is a gentle reminder of a gift we do not suggest putting on your wish list this year.

E-SCOOTERS

Partners in Warwickshire working together to improve road safety are urging the public not to buy e-scooters this Christmas because it's currently against the law to ride a privately owned e-scooter in any public place in the UK.

As e-scooters do not have number plates, signalling ability and don't always have visible rear lights, they can't be used legally on the roads.

Officers will also be using Section 59 of the Police Reform Act to issue a warning to riders of e-scooters and educate them as to the legal requirements. If a rider is under 16 years old then this advice will also be given to the parents.

Don't risk losing your Christmas gifts this year, follow the advice!
