No insurance = Seized Vehicle

Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team have been combatting vehicle crime

SNT patrols a local area known for ASB and trespass. Male seen acting suspiciously. Checks and a vehicle search revealed no insurance, no licence and cannabis possession. Vehicle seized and cannabis warning issued. Please don't drink/drug drive. You will lose your licence.



Drug related offence - Shuttington

An eagle eyed member of the public contacted the police after spotting a suspicious vehicle in the Shuttington area. Special constables located the vehicle and due to the information they had received, a stop search was carried out. The males were found to be in possession of cannabis and therefore a fixed penalty notice was issued to both parties.

Police received a report of a male causing anti-social behaviour in the Atherstone area.

Officers from the Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team conducted an extensive area search where the male was located. After local intelligence checks, police learnt the male was also wanted for criminal damage and harassment offences. The male was arrested and taken to custody to be processed.



Hartshill bike marking event

On 05/05/21, PCSO 6098 Hodson and PC 1391 Hughes teamed up with representatives from Neighbourhood Watch to deliver a bike marking event at Michael Drayton School in Hartshill. Bikes which attended were property marked and registered onto the Bike Register system. Other Incidents

Arrest - Atherstone – Drunk and Disorderly

A male has been arrested in Hartshill following reports of a male being aggressive to the public. Atherstone SNT located the male who was arrested and charged to court for drunk and disorderly.

Arrest - Atherstone – Drink Driving

Male was recently arrested on the M42 Motorway at approximately 9 am on suspicion of driving whilst under the influence of alcohol. Male was observed wandering in and out of the traffic and was in charge of a vehicle nearby that had broken down. Male dealt with in custody.

Arrest – M42 – Drug offences

Male arrested after being stopped by officers driving on the M42 .

Male and vehicle was searched with a quantity of believed to be cocaine found by officers.

Court result from a reported arrest a few weeks ago

Jamie Albrighton, 32, Atherstone, admitted assault causing actual bodily harm and possession of an offensive weapon (knife) in a public place (Station Street, Atherstone).

He was sent to prison for 16 weeks and ordered to pay a £128 victim surcharge.

Raza Rameez, aged 29 of Grove Lane, Birmingham was arrested and charged with possession with intent to supply Class A Drugs.

He has been remanded in custody and appeared at Coventry Magistrates' Court on Saturday (15 May). He will next appear at court at a future date.

The charge is in connection with an incident on the M42/A42 near Tamworth at around 7.40am on Friday 14 May.

Rural Crime Team

The Rural Crime Team continues to expand the specialist skills of the team with the use of new equipment and expertise.

In the past month, two Rural Officers and three officers from the Rural Specials have been trained on the two drones purchased for the team by local authorities in North Warwickshire Borough, Stratford and Warwick District.

The drones will be used on dedicated operations, patrols and response to incidents, assisting the team in addressing rural crime and the offenders who target rural communities. All deployments will be in line with CAA guidance and for policing purposes only.

In addition to the drones, two further officers from the Rural Crime Team have been trained and are now equipped as part of the force's Dual Purpose Bike Team. Warwickshire Police are one of only a few forces who have a Dual Purpose Bike Team who assist on the issue of antisocial behaviour caused by off road vehicles such as motorcycles, quad bikes and 4x4 vehicles.

This is in addition to the latest thermal imaging and night vision equipment received by the team.

Inspector Allison Wiggin, Rural Crime lead at Warwickshire Police, said: "This is a really exciting time for the Rural Crime team. The drones and dual purpose bikes will be extremely beneficial to officers and will ensure our capability to tackle rural crime is improved even further.

"Since its formation in October 2019, the Rural Crime Team have recovered nearly £700,000 worth of agricultural vehicles, plant and tools and this additional equipment will assist them further in targeting criminals affecting farms and rural areas.

These additional investments will give us greater ability to fight crime, arrest criminals and keep people safe."

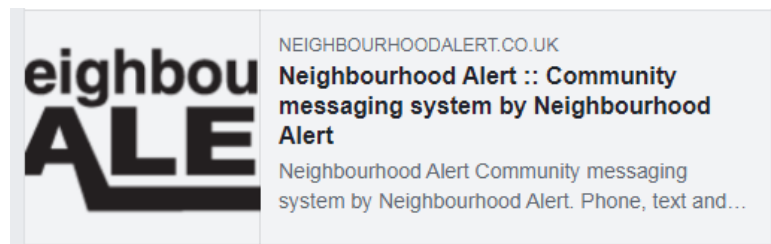
Neighbourhood Alert : Community messaging system by Neighbourhood alert

Your details will be confidential and it is a two-way messaging between officers and the public.

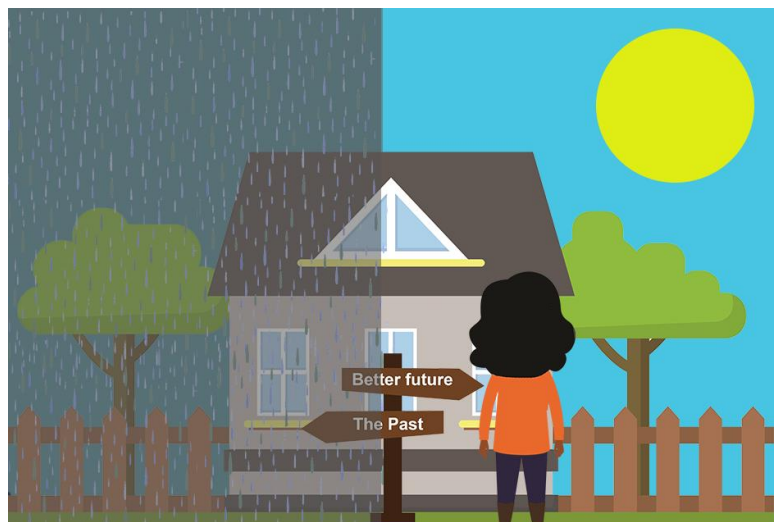
Messages can be location based, sent to a group or individual and can contain pictures.

Whilst the North Warwickshire Police Boxing and Fitness club has been closed we have upgraded the equipment ready to open the doors again. We have installed a new protective floor after a grant from the Chief Constable of Warwickshire Police, we then installed 4 new boxing bags and purchased equipment after grants from the Police and Crime commissioner and local councillors Mr. Jarvis and Mr. Singh.
