POLICE NON-EMERGENCY NUMBER 101
Only call 999 in an emergency when a crime is in progress or life is in danger.

Incidents reported during August 2021:

As well as the reports identified below, there were a significant number of incidents across our policing area that can not be included here, that were dealt with by the operations and communications centre and, where appropriate, followed up by the local SNT team and operational units. These included: malicious texts and threats; domestic incidents, some with threats and involving damage to property, theft as well as emotional and physical violence; breach of restraining orders and bail; safeguarding of vulnerable adults and children, some of who had been reported as missing; drunken behaviour; disputes between neighbours; alleged hate crimes; reports of making off without payment for fuel; thefts from supermarkets; suspected drug dealing; silent 999 calls; potential conflicts at private social events; reports of stalking; indecent exposure; vehicles with no insurance or being driven without a valid licence; dogs lose in traffic; road traffic collisions.

414-04/08 Loxley Close,
Wellesbourne

Report of anti-social behaviour, vehicle's engine being revved and loud music played.

229-12/08 Chedham Road,
Wellesbourne

Report of suspicious circumstances where a male and female were seen in informant's front garden at 08:30 and returned at 14:00. They were also taking pictures of houses.

247-13/08 Hammond Green,
Wellesbourne

Report of security camera recording,

made on 10/08 at 23:00, of a male examining a vehicle parked in a drive.

081-24/08 Park Lane, Snitterfield

Approx 23:30 On 23/08, theft of rear number plate, offenders disturbed whilst attempting to remove front number plate and drove off.

Kineton

116-02/08 Gifford Road, Lighthorne Heath

White Doosan 7/31E compressor stolen from building site between 18:00 31/07 and 07:00 02/08. Believed to have been towed away.

269-11/08 Hanbury Close, Kineton

Porsche Boxter, silver with black cloth roof, stolen overnight between 09/08 and 10/08.

396-11/08 Farm. Kineton

Field, with hay, deliberately set alight

806-06/08 Commercial vehicle premises, Warmington

Report of two suspicious vehicles, one on 05/08 and one on 06/08, being driven around the site, observing vehicles and buildings.

Vehicle off-roading and driving without due care, as well as littering.

Crime prevention advice for property marking



Marking your property is a positive way to fight crime, it can act as a deterrent, it allows you to prove ownership and helps you to identify your property easily if it is offered for sale. Marking your property also provides a means for the Police to identify stolen goods and return them to their owners.

There are a number of different ways to mark your property:

Visible Markers

Permanent marker pens

Waterproof paint

Stencils

Engraving

Specialised overt marking kits available on the market such as Cremark (*being used for Rural Crime property marking events*)

Invisible marker

UV Pens

Specialised forensic kits such as SmartWater, SelectaDNA, Red Web etc. (*SmartWater kits are available through Warwickshire Horse Watch and Neighbourhood Watch at discounted prices*).

What to Mark Your Property With:

You can put any kind of mark on your property to distinguish it from other similar items. Warwickshire Police, Warwickshire Rural Watch, Warwickshire Horse Watch and Neighbourhood Watch recommend using your postcode prefixed with the number of your address, i.e. 23 B78 1XX. A post code is unique to your property, which most organisations recognise and allows the goods to be identified and returned to you. Just putting a name or symbol on the property makes it identifiable, but does not provide details to the Police of who owns the property and where it came from.

It is strongly recommended that you take a photo of all your valuables and make a note of any distinguishing marks, including where and how you have property marked it. You can then print the photographs off and keep in a safe place, load onto your computer or keep on a memory stick. By having these records if your property is stolen you will have as much information as possible to give to the Police and also pass to retailers and other organisations to help locate your property.
