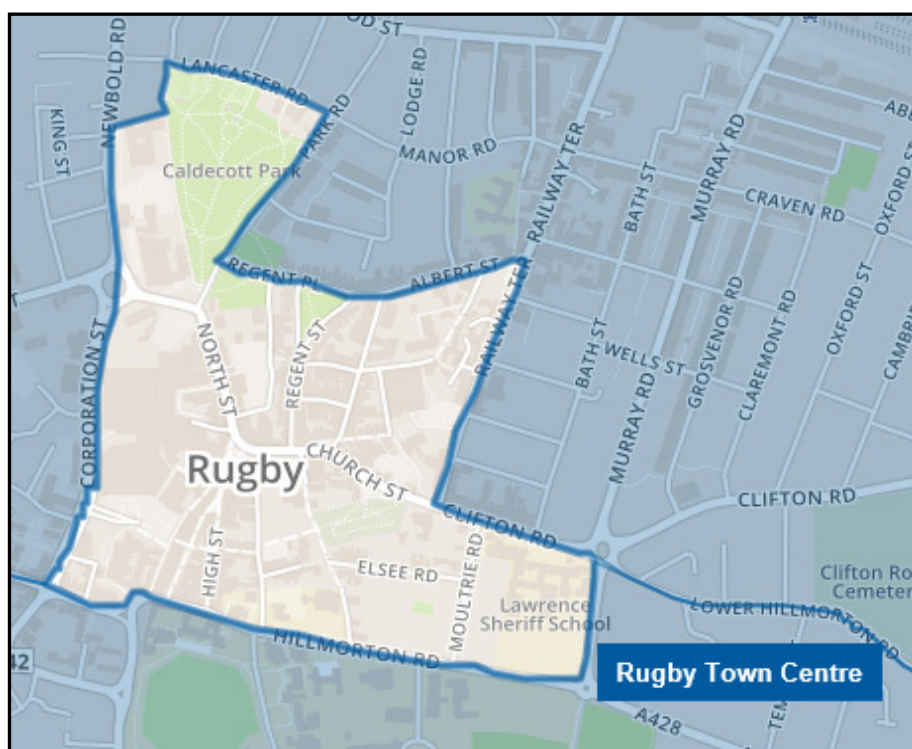

## **Crime Overview**

This section looks at the crimes of public interest that have occurred on the Rugby Town Centre Safer Neighbourhood Team policing area. Below is a brief summary of some of the incidents that have been reported to us over the last month:

Throughout August 51\* crimes were recorded in Rugby Town Centre. They are as follows:

**Anti Social Behaviour** – 3 incidents of ASB, of which 7 arrests were made for drunk and disorderly. This figure represents a decrease in the number of incidents from last month.

**Burglary** – During August there were 2 burglary offences committed in Rugby Town Centre. 3 people have been arrested in relation to the incidents and the investigations are continuing.

**Criminal Damage** – 8 reports of criminal damage occurred in Rugby Town Centre during August. This figure represents an increase in the number of incidents from last month, of which there were 1 incident. To date 4 people have been dealt with in relation to the incidents.

**Fraud** – There were 2 fraud offences recorded in Rugby Town Centre last month. Both incidents are currently under further investigation.

**Road** – Throughout August there was 1 road related incident in Rugby Town Centre. The incident led to the arrest of a person for drink driving.

**Suspicious Circumstance** – In August there was 1 sus circs incident which was crimed. The incidents led to the arrest of a person for a public order offence.

**Theft** – There were 28 thefts recorded, of which to date 12 people have been dealt with by the police. This figure represents a decrease in the number of offences from last month, of which 35 thefts were recorded.

**Violence** – 6 violence related offences resulted in 3 further arrests in the town centre. This figure represents a decrease in the number of incidents from last month, of which 7 offences were committed.

In addition to the above, a concern incident led to the arrest of a male who was currently wanted for an outstanding offence.

## **Appeals for Information**

### **Did you see collision in Rugby?**

**Officers from Rugby are appealing for witnesses following a collision between a car and a pedestrian on Railway Terrace on Wednesday (23 August).**

The incident happened around 3.25pm opposite the Stagecoach depot, when a 64-year-old man is reported to have been involved in a collision with a blue saloon car as he crossed the road.

The man was taken to hospital and suffered a fractured toe and a severely sprained ankle, and officers are appealing for any witnesses to contact them.

Police would like to speak to the driver of a blue car seen in the area at the time, who may be unaware of the collision. Anyone with information is asked to call police on 101, quoting incident number 160 of 24 August.

### **Police appealing for witnesses after assault and robbery in Rugby**

Police in Rugby are appealing for witnesses after a petrol station worker was violently assaulted in the early hours of this morning.

A man described as white, with an Eastern European accent, targeted the Gibbets Cross Service Station on the A5 in Rugby at around 4.30am today (Wednesday, 30 August).

The man, seen to be wearing a dark flat cap, olive green 'North Face' jacket, grey tracksuit and white trainers, put a member of staff in a headlock rendering him unconscious and subsequently threw him to the ground, before stealing cigarettes, alcohol and a car belonging to the member of staff - a silver Vauxhall Astra.

Detective Inspector Paul Thompson, from Warwickshire Police said: "The garage worker was violently assaulted as he went about his business, leaving him with a head injury for which he is currently receiving hospital treatment.

"We are appealing for anyone who saw the assault or saw someone travelling southbound on the A5 in a silver Vauxhall Astra in the early hours of this morning. We know that the vehicle was involved in a single vehicle collision a short time later, close to junction 16 of the M1, with the occupant leaving the scene.

"It is possible the suspect may have been seen exiting a HGV lorry parked in a lay-by near to Gibbets Cross Service Station prior to the robbery and so we are appealing for lorry drivers who may have given a lift to anyone matching the description of the suspect, or seen them getting out of a lorry, to get in touch."
