POLICE NON-EMERGENCY NUMBER 101

Only call 999 in an emergency when a crime is in progress or life is in danger

Recent Incidents (1 – 17/10/18)

Vehicle crime

0361 11/10/2018 Upton House, Banbury

The rear windscreen was smashed and a handbag removed from a vehicle parked near to the welcome centre.

0199 06/10/2018 Edge Hill Rd. Lighthorne Heath

There was an attempt to break into a van parked on the roadside and the lock was damaged.

Burglary and theft

1002 02/10/2018 14.00 Store, Wellesbourne

Two males used a trolley with bags to steal approx £100 worth of chocolate. They drove off in a blue Toyota.

0273 02/10/2018 Store, Wellesbourne

A male placed approx £50-£60 worth of meat in a bag and left the store. This was the same person who stole £200 worth of meat on 29/09/2018

0482 04/10/18 22.30 Store, Wellesbourne

A group of youths entered store and one male attempted to conceal a bottle (*not described*) but was interrupted by staff. They returned later and took other items.

Two youths in hoodies entered house through kitchen but were disturbed and made off

Owner returned to house and believes it has been broken into as she found drawers open and papers everywhere
